

## Golf Cart Operation

### TOWN OF SOUTHEY

### BYLAW NO. 03-2023

## A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHEY TO PERMIT THE OPERATION OF GOLF CARTS ON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPALITY

The Council of the Town of Southey, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

### Part 1- Title, Application, Definitions and Scope

- I. This bylaw may be referred to as “The Golf Cart Bylaw”.
- II. That all the provisions and enactments set forth in this Bylaw shall relate to and be in full force and effect within the limits of the Town of Southey. Subject to and in accordance with, s. 113.1 of The Traffic Safety Act and The Registration Exemption and Reciprocity Regulations (2014).
- III. Definitions

1. In this Bylaw a Golf Cart is a vehicle as defined in The Registration Exemption and Reciprocity Regulations “golf cart” means a self-propelled vehicle that:
  - i. Is designed to transport passengers and their equipment in an area designed as a golf course.
  - ii. Has 3 or more wheels.
  - iii. Cannot exceed 24 km/hour (14.9 mph) on level ground.
  - iv. Weighs less than 590 kgs (not including the weight of the passengers and golf clubs).

But does not include:

- v. An all-terrain vehicle as defined in The All Terrain Vehicles Act or
- vi. A low-speed vehicle as defined in the Motor Vehicle Safety Regulations, C.R.C, c. 1038.


### IV. Scope

1. It shall be lawful to operate a Golf Cart during the daylight hours one half hour before sunrise and one half hour after sunset on all roadways within the limits of the Town of Southey.

2. Persons operating a Golf Cart on the roadways within the limits of the Town of Southey:
  - Must not be operated on any provincial highway, other than to cross one.
  - Golf Carts cannot operate on any roadway with a posted speed of over 50km/hr.
3. The Golf Cart shall display a slow-moving warning device as defined in section 2(1) (kk) of The Vehicle Equipment Regulations (1987) and be displayed in accordance with section 10 of the regulations, with one side parallel to and not less than 900 millimeters nor more the 1500 millimeters from the ground.
4. No person shall operate a Golf Cart on the roadways within the limits of the Town of Southey unless they hold a valid Class 7 Driver's License or higher.
5. The owner of the Golf Cart must insure themselves and every other person who, with the owner's consent, operates that golf cart, against liability imposed by law arising out the ownership, use or operation of that golf cart and provides proof of insurance at the request of a peace officer. The minimum liability requirement is \$200,000.
6. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of not less the \$25.00 and not more than \$1,000.00.
7. The Town of Southey will monitor and inform SGI of any collisions that occur and if there were any injuries or fatalities.
8. Golf Carts must be operated in accordance with the rules of the Traffic Safety Act and any other Municipal Bylaw related to traffic. Federal and Provincial impaired driving laws also apply to the operation of a Golf Cart.
9. This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon approval thereof by Saskatchewan Government Insurance.

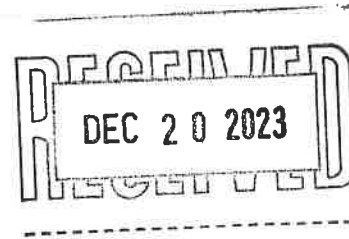
